

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This annual and EMIS report 2023/24 provides the status of the overall academic and administrative activities of MUSOM. As an Autonomous Business School of the Mid-West University, MUSOM is committed to providing three academic programs which are MBA, BBA and BHM. It is through Department of Research, Innovation and Entrepreneurship MUSOM promotes research, publication, entrepreneurship education, business incubation support in line with Mid-West University's goal for quality research and University Grants Commission's incubation and entrepreneurship education support.

In this year 2023/24, MUSOM is running MBA and BBA programs. School is planning to run BHM program from upcoming academic intake.

Key Achievements made by the school in 2023/24 are as follows:

- 1. Academic calendar was completely followed and implemented conducting all academic and administrative activities line with the annual plan of action.
- 2. On behalf of QAA, the PRT follow up visit made by UGC under leadership of PRT coordinator, Prof. Dr. Kesarjung Baral was successfully conducted and follow up response report was submitted to UGC for accreditation.
- 3. MUSOM Integrated plan of EMIS, LMS, Website and Enterprise system was completed and made live for public.
- 4. Entrepreneurship Education program with the support from UGC NEHEP was conducted, Business Incubation was improved with services and facilities, and MBA student Sanjina Giri received 27 lakh seed fund amount for enterprise development.
- 5. As an integral part of academic excellence, faculty/mini research projects on different themes were completed.
- 6. Online *Journal of Entrepreneurship & Management Studies. Volume 1, No.1 & 2* via NepJOL were published.
- 7. Mr. Mukunda Sharma, Assistant Prof. Of MUSOM was given paid leave for studying PhD at the University of Colorado and Assistant Prof. Govinda KC joined PhD at the Graduate School of Management, MU. And almost all faculty members completed M.Phil.
- 8. Three faculty members participated in faculty development programs of the university.
- 9. MUSOM boundary wall construction project was completed.

In the year 2023/24, there are 376 students enrolled in the MBA and BBA. Share of MBA and BBA program wise enrollment is 87% in BBA and 13% in MBA. The gender status of share 53 % of female in BBA, 47% male in BBA and 66% of male in MBA and 34% of female in MBA in MUSOM. The overall GPI in the year 2020/21 is 1.03 in MBA and BBA programs.

In the year 2023/24, there are 56 students graduated out of 63 students in BBA and 27 students graduated in MBA program including partial results. In the year 2023/24, the total numbers of teaching staffs is 15.

It was established in 2019 as an autonomous business school for promotion of market relevant management education, research, innovation and enterprise development. 1.3 An Overview of Report

Education Management Information System (EMIS), ERPS, CMS, LMS, and Mobile Apps are different data repository system of MUSOM which store, analyze, and report the information of students, faculties, staffs, administration, and academic activities. Under the control and leadership of Internal Quality Assurance Committee (IQAC) IT cell at the MUSOM is specially designed to monitor the performance of education programs offered by the MUSOM and to manage the distribution and allocation of educational resources. From year 2023/24 the MUSOM undertook the task of publishing basic statistical information about the MUSOM academic and administrative activities through its annual publication in the form Annual & EMIS Report. This report presents information about the higher education and administrative programs in the MUSOM with comprehensive data. It is expected that the information in this report will be useful for planning, policy making, designing programs and projecting resources of the academic and administrative programs with special references to MUSOM.

School is using GIDC software with an aim of providing updated information of the education and administrative system in the School. This is the first attempt to bring out such a comprehensive report of statistical information. The main purpose of this report is to provide adequate, accurate, timely and reliable data to the MUSOM stakeholders.

This report comprises information about MUSOM, key achievements, student enrollment, pass graduates, gender parity index (GPI), teaching and non-teaching staffs, academic department and programs, administrative and financial status of the school.

1.3.1 Organization of the Report

There are ten sections in the report; first section provides introduction of the report, second section provides information of faculty in the School. Section three gives faculty-wise and program-wise information on enrollment status and gender-wise distribution of the available data. Section four offers data on GPI. Section five provides information on pass rate from the School. Section six presents information about research and publications of the School. Section seven provides the information of teaching and non-teaching staffs of the School. Section eight presents information about student teacher ratio. Section nine presents information on the financial source and other financial aspect of the School. Information on teaching and non-teaching staffs is presented in section nine. Section ten provides information of scholarship. The main texts are followed by annexure in the report. It includes a total of 5 annexes.

1.3.2 Methodology

This report was prepared through the direct or indirect participation and contribution of departments, Exam Section, IT Unit, Account and Administrative Section within MUSOM. Data were collected from the concerned departments, section and cell of the school. The data collected are presented in a simple format using table and figure as per requirements. Data collection process was based on use of EMIS, Website, official Facebook and physical documents as per need. Descriptive statistics are used for the analysis of data.

ABOUT BUSINESS SCHOOL PROGRAMS

MUSOM is an autonomous institute of Mid-West University with vision of transforming the school as the world class business school in Nepal. The School has two academic departments, research and innovation department, incubation center, exam cell, IT Unit, Primary health care unit and Account and Admin section which are designed to creating constructive environment for effective academic service in terms of teaching learning and research, entrepreneurship, innovation, exam, academia community linkage and quality publication. MUSOM is recognized as a leading business school and top ten in Nepal due to good performance academic services of the school.

2.1 Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA)

Four-Year BBA program at MUSOM is designed as labor market driven program to develop the business related conceptual, practical knowledge and holistic leadership skills that all successful managers need. It provides a basis for life time learning and continuous career development in the area of entrepreneurship. The program's strength lies in its ability to develop quantitative and qualitative problem solving skills through coursework, case study, seminar, workshop, debate, publication, field visit, and internship. It also provides the necessary knowledge and skills for success in an entry-level career and graduate study. It helps the students develop a wider understanding of the challenges business leaders face, some dimensions of the business world, and the impact they can have on their local community through their leadership.

Program Goal: To produce professional graduates and leaders through market driven courses having developed self-employment mindset.

- 1. Help students gain employ-ability skills for future career business leaders and managerial post,
- 2. Produce result-oriented and competent business leaders,

2.2 Master of Business Administration (MBA)

Two-year MBA program is designed for students from a wide variety of disciplinary backgrounds seeking international career opportunities through the development of their leadership and managerial abilities. MBA is an internationally respected management qualification, which enhances the skills and competencies of a leadership career. The program covers the general business and management curriculum with an opportunity to specialize.

Students are encouraged to apply concepts learned and become familiar with theories. The course content improves students' skills to manage and lead organizations effectively through the development of employability and understanding of the wider range of management knowledge, skills, concepts and practices.

Program Goal: Prepare skilled and self-employment mindset leaders and graduates.

Program Objectives

- 2) Work with trained and experienced tutors responsible to guide students through every step of the learning process.

2.3 Bachelor of Hotel Management (BHM)

BHM is a four-year program leading to the award of Bachelor of Hotel Management (BHM) initiated as the pilot academic program for vocational education. With this program, MUSOM aims at reaching underprivileged community that is deprived of quality higher education due to poor economic condition.

2.4 BBA Admission & Orientation

Admission

More than 120 applicants sought their admission place in the BBA in 2023. 70 candidates passed CMAT and all 70 candidates were short-listed for personal interview. 70 candidates were offered admission.

Orientation Program

An orientation program for BBA 2023 batch students was conducted on 13 December, 2023 at Kausik Event Venue, Surkhet. The event was commenced in the chair of Dillu Prasad Dhungana, Head of Undergraduate Studies and in the presence of Dr. Sushil Kumar Shahi as a chief guest, Director, MUSOM. All faculty members were present.

Assistant Prof, Dillu Dungana welcomed the new batch and shared MUSOM evaluation and grading system related to BBA program. This was followed remarkable words by Dr. Sushil Kumar Shahi, director, who congratulated newcomers and gave an overview of the MUSOM and BBA program to the students. He also shared his views on creativity, innovation, and quality education. During the program, BBA students expressed their expectation from MUSOM during study and after study. Students conducted talent hunt event and presented cultural shows.

2.5 MBA Admission & Orientation

MBA Admission

Master of Business Administration in 2023 attracted 27 applications. Of these, only 17 candidates passed GMAT in round-1. 17 candidates were shortlisted for personal interviews in round-2. Admission offers were made to only 17 candidates. Finally, 15candidates joined the program.

Orientation Program

An orientation program for MBA 2023 batch students was held in April 2024 Kausik Event Venue, Surkhet. The event commenced with lamp lighting by Dr. Sushil Kumar Shahi, Director, MUSOM. president of Student Welfare Council, President of Parent Council and all faculty members were present. During induction session, focusing on curricula and ECA, Mr. Rishi Khanal shared how MUSOM conducts MBA using latest teaching-learning methods. He made students clear about MUSOM Evaluation system. This was followed by Assistant Prof. Govind KC, who shared how to face MBA program.

Finally, Dr. Sushil Kumar Shahi, director, congratulated students and shared key 21st century skills through MBA experience, connecting creativity, critical thinking, digital skills, communication, research, problemsolving, leadership, and decision making skills with career development.




Figure 2.1. Semester Wise Students Enrollment in BBA







Figure 2.3. Semester Wise Gender Status of Enrollment in MBA



Program Wise Gender Status of Students






Figure 2.4 BBA Program Gender Status

2.8 Gender Parity Index

Gender Parity Index (GPI) presents the access of girl's students to higher education. It is one of the most important indicators which is used to measure the participation of girls in higher education. GPI in higher education is expressed as the ratio of the number of girls to the number of boys enrolled in higher education. A value of near one indicates equality, less than 1 display in favor of boys, and value larger than 1 means disparity in favor of girls.

In 2022/2023, the GPI in MUSOM is 0.42, which mean there is favor of Boys compared to Girl's enrollment and shown in the table 4.1 and figure 4.1.1 and figure 4.1.2.




Figure 2.6 Gender and GPI of MUSOM




Figure 2.8 Program Wise Graduation




Figure 2.9 Male and Female Graduation in BBA




Figure 2. 10 Male and female Graduation in MBA




Figure 3.1 Teaching Staffs According to Faculty as well as Academic Degree






Figure 3.2 Teaching Staff According to Designation


Figure 3.3 Teaching Staffs According to Service




Figure 3.5 Distribution of Teaching Staffs According to Gender




Figure 3.6 Distribution of Non-Teaching Staffs According to Position
